

Photos from July 2025 Trip to Slimbridge. Just what I can discern. You might see others/different.
(Numbering the photos left to right and then top to bottom):

- 1 Adult Black-headed Gulls
Black-tailed Godwits 27-28 breeding plumage adults
Probable Redshank amongst Godwits
1 Gosling (probably Greylag)
Teal 1 or 2 (bottoms up!)
- 2 Juvenile Wood Sandpiper
- 3 Little Ringed Plover 1 Juv + 1 Adult
Green Sandpiper 1 Adult
Pied Wagtail - well camouflaged towards back left of photo
- 4 3 Common Redshank + 1 Ruff (preening) moulting from Breeding to non-breeding plumage
- 5 Sparrowhawk Male
- 6 Male Ruff moulting from breeding to non-breeding plumage
- 7 Grey Heron Adult
- 8 Moorhen Adult
- 9 Same photo as 4 (Whoops! Deliberate? mistake)
- 10 Breeding plumage Black-tailed Godwit
- 11 Spotted Redshank (between summer and winter plumage) male?
Breeding plumage Black-tailed Godwit
Half a Common Redshank (starting to moult from breeding plumage)
- 12 Avocet 1 adult plus two juveniles of different ages/size
- 13 Adult Lapwing
- 14 Dunlin in breeding plumage with juvenile Little Ringed Plover behind
- 15 Tufted Ducks – 1 adult female plus 2 juveniles, one diving
- 16 Leucistic Lapwing in water plus two more Lapwings on shore
- 17 2 Adult Common Cranes
- 18 Green Sandpiper Adult
- 19 Adult Yellow Wagtail – prob. Female?
- 20 Adult Little Ringed Plover
- 19 Juvenile Little Ringed Plover
5 Juvenile Pied Wagtail (or are some of those Yellows?) The juvenile and first winter Pied and Yellow Wagtails are surprisingly similar. Take a look In a good bird book.
